Entrance Requirements

The programme accepts applications from local candidates who fulfill the following entrance requirements:

- Applicants should hold a recognised Bachelor's degree.
- Applicants should, preferably, have some background or working experience in the field of education, guidance or counselling in a school or community setting, such as guidance teachers and social workers.
- Applicants whose entrance qualification is obtained from an institution in a non-English speaking system should fulfill one of the following English proficiency requirements:
 - IELTS 6.0;
 - a TOEFL score of 550;
 - Band 6 in the Chinese Mainland's College English Test (CET).
- Shortlisted applicants may be required to attend an admission interview or test.

Introduction

This programme offers specialised training in educational counselling for professionals in education and social services, aimed at leading to professional accreditation and earning the professional membership of Hong Kong Professional Counselling Association(HKPCA), as "HKPCA Certified Counsellor".





Programme Aims

This programme aims to:

- help participants establish their professional membership in HKPCA, finally leading to the status of certified counsellors;
- help participants acquire an understanding of various counselling theories and its application;
- equip them with the professional skills of certified counsellors, for facilitating students' personal growth.

Special Features



- Provide training in the theory and practice of counselling;
- Provide 300 hours of supervised counselling placement which is the highest among local universities ranging from 180 hours to 250 hours;
- Deal with the student needs arising in kindergartens, primary and secondary schools, and postsecondary institutions (e.g. community colleges);
- Put an emphasis on the collaboration between school and community;
- Run in an outreaching model, student placements will be arranged in satellite counselling centres in collaboration with NGOs and community colleges;
- Stress on the psychoeducational assessment and evaluation of counselling cases.
