ABOUT THE TALK

This talk introduces an alternative case management (CM) model introduced in special schools in Singapore known as the Triple-D Model of primary CM system. The Triple-D stands for 'Diagnostics', 'Dialogics' and 'Didactics'. These three D-phases can be re-labeled as Case Measurement, Case Consultation, Case Development (for transition from Dialogics to Didactics) and Case Intervention respectively, and collectively, they form a very comprehensive model of the primary case management system.

Dr Noel K.H. Chia, an elected Fellow of The College of Teachers (London, UK), is an Associate Professor with the Early Childhood & Special Needs Education Academic Group at the National Institute of Education, Nanyang Technological University, Singapore.
